Any and all demonstrations which disrupt, interrupt, or obstruct the Council's ability to conduct City business are prohibited. No signs, posters or other large objects shall be brought into the Council Chambers or other meeting place if doing so would disrupt, disturb or otherwise impede the orderly course of the meeting.

**PUBLIC COMMENT**

Persons wishing to speak on closed session items have a choice of doing so either immediately prior to the closed session or at the time for comments on items at the open session.

**Providing Public Comment for Topics not on the Meeting Agenda:**

Time shall be devoted to provide public comments for items not on the agenda. Under the Brown Act, Council is prohibited from taking action on items not on the agenda, but the matter may be referred to staff or to a subsequent meeting.

**Providing Public Comment:**

1. Any person wishing to provide public comment is asked to complete a comment card. Please include your name and address. Each speaker will be limited to up to three continuous minutes, which may not be delegated or deferred.
2. The City provides a podium for public comment. Comments addressed to the Council shall occur during the appropriate time on the agenda and should not be construed as an opportunity for dialogue. Each speaker will be limited to three continuous minutes, which may not be delegated or deferred.

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### **CONSENT**

**a) CONSIDERATION OF RESOLUTION 23-25 APPROVING CERTAIN DEMANDS**

It is recommended that the City Council approve Resolution 23-25 approving payment of City Warrants in the aggregate amount of \$316,835.93; Sierra Madre Library Warrants in the aggregate amount of \$2,052.77; and Payroll Transfer in the aggregate amount of \$493,546.34 for the Fiscal Year ending June 30, 2023.

**b) CONSIDERATION OF RESOLUTION 23-26, AUTHORIZING THE CITY TO ENTER INTO PARTICIPATION AGREEMENTS AND ALLOCATION AGREEMENTS WITH CVS, ALLERGAN, TEVA, WALMART, AND WALGREENS IN SETTLEMENT OF A MULTIDISTRICT LITIGATION TO ADDRESS THE OPIOID PUBLIC HEALTH CRISIS**

It is recommended that the City Council adopt Resolution 23-26, authorizing the City to enter into participation agreements and allocation agreements with Teva, Allegan, CVS, Walgreens, and Walmart in the settlement of a multi-district litigation to address the opioid public health crisis.

**c) CONSIDERATION OF THE AWARD OF PROFESSIONAL AUDITING SERVICES CONTRACT TO ROGERS, ANDERSON, MALODY & SCOTT, LLP (RAMS) TO PERFORM THE ANNUAL AUDIT SERVICES FOR THREE FISCAL YEARS COMMENCING WITH THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 2023**

It is recommended that the City Council award the contract for Professional Auditing Services to Rogers, Anderson, Malody & Scott, LLP (RAMS) to perform the annual audit services for three fiscal years commencing with the fiscal year ending June 30, 2023, with the option to renew for an additional two years.

**d) SECOND READING OF ORDINANCE NO. 1465, AMENDING CHAPTER 17.22 (ACCESSORY DWELLING UNITS) OF TITLE 17 (ZONING) OF THE SIERRA MADRE MUNICIPAL CODE**

It is recommended that the City Council introduce for second reading, by title only, Ordinance No. 1465, amending Chapter 17.22 (Accessory Dwelling Units) of Title 17 (Zoning) of the Sierra Madre Municipal Code.

## **CEQA FINDINGS**

Pursuant to Chapter 2.6, Public Resources Code commencing with section 21080.17, the City Council finds that the adoption of this Ordinance, which implements the provisions of Government Code section 65852.2, does not apply to Division 13 (Environmental Quality) and is thus statutorily exempt for the purposes of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA).

- e) **SECOND READING OF ORDINANCE NO. 1466, A GENERAL ORDINANCE CLEAN-UP AMENDING VARIOUS CHAPTERS OF THE SIERRA MADRE MUNICIPAL CODE**  
It is recommended that the City Council introduce for second reading, by title only, Ordinance No. 1466.

## **CEQA FINDINGS**

Pursuant to Government Code section 65852.21, subdivision (j), and Government Code section 66411.7, subdivision (n), staff recommends the City Council finds the adoption of this Ordinance is not a project for purposes of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and is statutorily exempt.

- f) **CONSIDERATION OF BID PROPOSAL NOT TO EXCEED \$75,000 FOR THE PURCHASE, INSTALLATION, AND PROGRAMMING FO FIVE (5) NEW MOTOROLA APX8500 MID-POWER ALL-BAND MOBILE RADIOS TO REPLACE THE CURRENT MOBILE RADIOS IN THE DEPARTMENT'S VEHICLES AS PART OF A MULTI-YEAR REPLACEMENT PROJECT**

It is recommended that the City Council approve the bid proposal not to exceed \$75,000 for the purchase, installation, and programming of five (5) new Motorola APX8500 mid-power all-band mobile radios to replace the current mobile radios in the Department's vehicles as part of a multi-year replacement project.
